



CRRSAA HEERF Reporting Disclosure

Report as of July 2, 2021

1. On December 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) was signed into law. On January 14, 2021 the U.S. Department of Education announced that the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund (HEERFII) II is now available to institutions of higher education (IHEs) to serve students and ensure learning continues during the COVID-19 pandemic. As provided for by the Department of Education (DOE) as a provision of the CRRSAA, Randall University has received funds and distributed those funds directly to students to assist them with emergency financial relief. These grants are intended to be used by students for tuition, fees, food, housing, course materials, technology, transportation, health care, and childcare.
2. Randall University has received \$125,080.00 from the United States Department of Education pursuant to our Certification and Agreement for emergency financial aid grants to students.
3. As of July 2, 2021, Randall University has distributed \$126,000.00 to students pursuant to Section 314(a)(1) of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA).
4. Randall University estimated that 161 students were deemed eligible with notification to each student that a grant was being distributed.
5. A small number of students (7) opted to have their grant applied to their student account. Randall University received written permission from the student to apply the student grant to their student account. This information is on file in the Bursar's office and Finance office.
6. As of July 2, 2021, Randall University has distributed emergency financial aid grants to 161 students under Section 314(a)(1) of the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA).
7. The amount of individual grants were based on a three-tiered system using a student's EFC as a guide as to their placement in the tiered system. The minimum tier grant was \$350, the middle tier grant was \$656.25, and the maximum grant tier was \$1,063.64. The average total grant to each student was just over \$682.
8. The balance of \$920 (\$126,000 -\$125,080) was funded using funds from the Randall University Institutional Allocation.
9. Randall University's student emergency grant funds have been exhausted and no additional grants will be disbursed unless additional funding becomes available.
